#### 6th Grade

**English:** Students have read an excerpt from *The Diary of Anne Frank* and will be reading a retelling of a Greek myth. Using these texts, students are describing characters' responses to events and analyzing the connotations of specific word choice.

**Math:** Students have been solving problems with fractions and mixed numbers. Next the students will use their knowledge of fractions to solve ratio and rate problems.

**Science:** Students have been learning about transfer of thermal energy and have experimented with the circulation of the atmosphere and oceans. This has lead into studying weather patterns and climates.

**Social Studies:** Students have completed their study of the Fur Trade. Our next topic will be exploring the early treaties that led to Minnesota becoming a state. Don't forget you have a pass that will allow your child to visit any of the Minnesota Historical Society sites free with a paid adult.

**Religion:** Students are completing unit 3 of their classes and are learning about the kings and prophets of the Old Testament. They also are learning about how these people point to the coming of the Messiah at Christmas. Students are also learning about different saints and gaining skills in characteristics such as bravery, gratitude, and forgiveness through the Positivity Project.

#### 7th Grade

**English:** Students are reading *Touching Spirit Bear* by Ben Mikaelson. They have been analyzing the use of figurative language, identifying how plot events influence characters, and interpreting symbols the author uses to deepen the meaning of the text.

**Math:** Students have been learning about ratios, unit rates, and proportions. They are learning to convert measurements using dimensional analysis. They will end the semester learning to use and construct scale drawings.

**Science:** Students have been learning about one of the characteristics of living things: organization. After an initial review of organizational structure from cell to organism, they will focus on different human body systems and their functions as well as plant and other animal systems.

**Social Studies:** Students are currently exploring the U.S. before the Civil War. Our current focus is on Reform movements of the 1800s.

**Religion:** Students are working on a presentation about Marian Apparitions, as there are two Marian feast days in December. We are also closing out the semester reviewing for our final.

#### 8th Grade

**English:** Students are reading *Farewell to Manzanar* by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston. Students have also been working on narrative writing, They will be writing a personal narrative about an event in their life where they learned a lesson.

**Math:** Algebra I students have just finished up a chapter on linear and nonlinear functions. They will be applying what they learned to find the slope of a line, to use lines of fit to make predictions, and to investigate relationships between quantities using scatter plots.

**Science:** Students have been learning about weathering and experimented with both mechanical and chemical weathering. This has lead into evaluating different soil conservation methods.

**Social Studies:** The eighth graders continue to explore countries around the world with the latest destination being Latin America. They will conclude the semester with the Holiday Traditions project. I'm excited to hear their presentations.

**Religion:** Students are learning about the various modes of life in the Church and will be learning about our Dominican heritage in particular. We are also completing unit 4 in preparation for their last test before Christmas break.



# Tips for Schoology and Powerschool

Bethlehem Academy uses the integrated systems of Schoology and PowerSchool to manage class information, assignments, grades, and attendance. See the information below on how each system can be helpful to you:

#### Schoology

Bethlehem Academy uses Schoology to post daily lessons and assignments and track daily grades. Use Schoology to see your child's day-to-day progress. It is a useful tool to see if your child is missing work.

In advisory, students check their progress weekly in Schoology. Ask your child to show you his/her grades. The image at the right shows where to see daily and missing work in Schoology.

#### PowerSchool

PowerSchool is used to track attendance and report semester grades. Use PowerSchool to view the final reporting of semester grades.
