617 SCHOOL DISTRICT ENSURANCE OF PREPARATORY AND HIGH SCHOOL STANDARDS

[Note: With repeal of the Profile of Learning, school districts no longer are required to comply with the procedures set forth in this policy. School districts that retain any portion of the Profile of Learning graduation requirements, however, may choose to retain all or a portion of this policy and may implement and manage the Profile of Learning content standards in whatever manner they deem appropriate.]

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all locally adopted preparatory and high school content standards of the Profile of Learning are addressed directly in both curriculum and assessment for all students, including those with special needs.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The policy of the school district is to implement the Minnesota Graduation Standards, including local adoption of the former Profile of Learning content standards, during the transition to the implementation of the required Minnesota Academic Standards.
- B. This policy ensures that all students who qualify and elect to satisfy their graduation requirements through the Profile of Learning content standards will continue to receive instruction, curriculum and assessment which address the preparatory and high school content standards of the Profile of Learning. This policy also defines how technology will be integrated across student learning areas.

In implementing the preparatory and high school content standards, the school district will work to improve the scope and sequences of curriculum, research-based instructional skills of teachers and other district staff who work with students, and alternative assessments of student achievement while making the transition to the required Minnesota Academic Standards.

III. ESTABLISHMENT OF CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

A. <u>Preparatory Content Standards</u>

- 1. As a component of the district's curriculum review process, staff will review all current state content standards.
- 2. Departments will continue to review standards and implement State standards in coursework.
- These standards will align with State standards and be published in school documents.

B. <u>High School Content Standards</u>

The school district will follow Policy 613, Graduation Requirements, as it implements the graduation standards. This policy ensures that all students will receive instruction, curriculum and assessment which addresses the high school content standards of the Profile of Learning in all learning areas and that the uses of technology are integrated across student learning areas.

C. <u>Assessment of Content Standards</u>

Content standards shall be assessed through formative and summative subject-specific assessments and will be reported in the student information system and as final grades.

D. Additional Requirements

The school district requires additional work in some subjects to qualify for graduation. See Policy 613 for more details.

E. Special Needs Students

Students with special needs will generally be expected to meet all graduation standards at the same level as their peers, except when the IEP team determines that the graduation requirements are inappropriate for a specific student.

F. <u>Evaluation and Remediation of Student Difficulties and Achievement</u>

- Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTSS) is used to assign students to Tier
 I, II, and III. This system will identify students who are struggling to
 achieve and implement a pyramid intervention plan to ensure
 achievement.
- 2. Additional classroom instructional methods, Title, Indigenous Support, and other services will be considered for all students struggling to achieve.
- 3. At the high school level, a systematic system of credit recovery will be in place to assist students in achieving upon failure of a course.
