DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM INFORMATION

PROGRAM 38 hours of classroom instruction, 6 hours behind-the-wheel, and 6 hours observation in a driver education vehicle.

SCHEDULE Schedule to be announced by the instructor. Most schools offer an after-school course.

Selected students for a session must adhere to the program schedule and have 100% attendance. Absences will subject the student to be dropped from the program.

ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION Fifteen and a half years of age or older and under 19 years of age. Students must have a current Hawaii instructional permit in order to enroll.

CERTIFICATION Non-credit after school course. Certificates of completion are awarded for the classroom and behind-the-wheel instruction. The student's permanent transcript record will show satisfactory completion of the course.

STUDENT & PARENTS/LEGAL GUARDIANS OBLIGATIONS Students and parents/legal guardians must attend a mandatory orientation class and are expected to practice driving skills for a minimum of 50 hours, 10 hours of which must be at night.

FEE \$10, non-refundable.

ENROLLMENT Limited. See school driver education coordinator for details.

THE BENEFITS OF DRIVER EDUCATION

Learning how to drive correctly from the start is important. Quality driver education provided by certified professional driver education instructors is the best way to learn this lifelong skill. Here are more benefits:

1. Safety First

The goal of the program is to produce safe and efficient drivers. The course teaches teen drivers how to: reduce risks on the road (distracted, impaired and drugged driving); be respectful of other drivers; establish life-saving habits (seat belt use, driving speed limit); and develop a more mature attitude behind-the-wheel. In addition,

all driver education vehicles are equipped with dual-control brakes for instructor on the passenger side. This will insure safety on the road at all times during driving lessons.

2. Stress-Free Learning

Learning to drive is stressful for the student and parent. The driver education instructor is trained to help students learn without additional stress.

3. Job Preparation

Many jobs require a driver license. The driver education program will help prepare students for future jobs that may require driving skills.

4. Road Test Preparation for a Driver's License

The behind-the-wheel training prepares the learner for the road test by helping the learner feel comfortable riding with an instructor. This reduces stress on the learner.

5. Parent/Legal Guardian Learning

Parents/Legal Guardians can improve and/or correct their driving skills by learning the new methods being taught to their teen driver.

BEHIND-THE-WHEEL LESSONS

The students will receive six basic behind-the-wheel lessons during the in-car instruction phase of driver education.

Lesson 1 - **INTRODUCTION TO DRIVING:** pre-start, starting the engine, putting the vehicle in motion, stopping, left turns, right turns

Lesson 2 - **BASIC MANEUVERS:** lane control, lateral maneuver-move into traffic, backing straight, backing around a corner, lane changing

Lesson 3 - **RESIDENTIAL DRIVING:** alley turnabout, three-point turnabout, scanning skills

Lesson 4 - **RURAL DRIVING:** following distance, passing

Lesson 5 - **CITY DRIVING:** angle, perpendicular, and parallel parking

Lesson 6 - **FREEWAY DRIVING:** merging, exiting, lane changing, following distance
