PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

The following traffic and parking regulations must be followed at all times:

- A parking pass is required to park on campus during school hours.
- **Faculty and Staff** must complete a parking pass application and be assigned a parking pass that must be displayed on the car's rear view mirror when parking on campus.
- **Students** must complete a parking pass application and be assigned a parking pass that must be displayed on the car's rear view mirror when parking on campus. Students need a parent/guardian signature. \$5.00 fee
- The parking pass is assigned to a specific car and is non-transferable. If you have multiple cars, you will need to submit an application and receive a parking pass for each car.
- All cars must park in marked stalls in designated areas **(do not park in landscaped areas)** and is on a first come-first serve basis.
 - Faculty & Staff – Black top across from front tennis courts, parking lot between gym and band room and parking lot between band room and E building.
 - Student parking – parking is around the oval. Motorcycle, mopeds, and bicycles shall park in the designated area behind the main office and F Building.
- Drivers must observe and abide by all traffic signs and markers. Cones are not to be used to "save" parking stalls.
- Speeding, "revving" of engine, blaring music, and cruising around the campus is strictly prohibited.
- All parking areas are off limits during school hours.
- Vehicle owners park at their own risk. Kalani High School will not be responsible for theft or damage to vehicles or contents.
- Please notify the Office of any changes in vehicles.

Students who are in violation of any Parking and Traffic Regulations may be subject to warnings, suspension, or revocation of parking privileges and/or may receive appropriate consequences for insubordination.

Campus Traffic Flow & Security Gates:

There are three vehicle entrances to the campus: Kalani Iki Street main entrance, Kalani Iki back entrance, and Kalanianaʻole Highway (Koko Head entrance).
