LeRoy-Ostrander School Overview

LeRoy-Ostrander Public School has an enrollment of approximately 300 students in grades K-12. The students are housed in one building. The building is separated into the main building that houses the high school and there is an elementary wing on the lower level. All students share the gym, music room, media center, commons, computer lab, and the swimming pool. Also on the school grounds there is an elementary playground, main football field, a practice field, and a baseball field.

<u>LeRoy-Ostrander School and McKinney</u> Vento Act

LeRoy-Ostrander is committed to addressing the challenges that homeless children and youth face in enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school. Under the McKinney-Vento Act, state educational agencies ensure that each homeless child and youth has equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including a public preschool education, as all children and youth.

LeRoy-Ostrander High School has always tried to provide as much educational opportunity and information on homelessness and youth in need.. The following is McKinney-Veto Homeless Education Information:

- Children and youth who are in and awaiting foster care are removed from the definition of homelessness.
- All local agencies that receive Title I Part A funds must reserve funds to support homeless students.
- Homeless children who meet the eligibility criteria do not face barriers to accessing academic and extracurriculuar activites.
- Local agencies must have procedures to identify and remove barriers that prevent students from receiving appropriate credit for full or partial coursework..
- The definition of school also includes preschool.
