District Mechanical & Master Electrician Maintenance Job Description

Supervisor:

Director of Buildings and Grounds

Job Summary:

Performs all electrical work and general mechanical maintenance to provide safe, and well maintained buildings for students, staff, and the public.

Requirements:

- 1. High School graduate or equivalent.
- 2. Master Electrician License.
 - a. Two years of post-secondary education and three years experience as a Lead Electrician/General Foreman, or equivalent.
 - b. Willingness to allow qualified district personnel to work under this positions license as allowed by Minnesota Electrical Code.
- 3. Current valid driver's license. Must be able to drive district vehicles per State and District insurance regulations.
- 4. Chief Class C Boilers License or willingness to obtain.
- 5. CPO License or willingness to obtain.
- 6. Carry a cell phone 24 hours a day, and respond to emergency situations as required.

Qualifications\Duties:

- 1. Knowledge and expertise in the areas of facilities management, electrical repair, mechanical maintenance, carpentry, welding, and minor vehicle and grounds equipment repair & maintenance. Air Conditioning (HVAC) maintenance skills desired but not mandatory.
- 2. Maintain an inventory of spare parts.
- 3. Perform Health & Safety tests and inspections.
- 4. Maintain records on maintenance work performed.
- 5. Operation and maintenance of Building Automation Systems.
- 6. Fill in for Lead people or delivery driver in emergency situations.
- 7. Ability to manage budget in a fiscally responsible manner.
- 8. Ability to be flexible, set priorities, handle multiple tasks and organize work flow.
- 9. Key job characteristics include thorough knowledge of the current National Electrical Code and knowledge of current practices in the electrical trades, including safety practices, tools, and testing devices; thorough knowledge of building codes, fire codes and relevant ordinances as they pertain to electrical work and safe working conditions; knowledge of motorized, and non-motorized equipment maintenance and repair; good project management skills with the ability to prioritize work; a working ability to read and follow verbal and written instructions (in English); good planning, organizational, and negotiation skills; good oral communication skills; and the ability to work effectively with others.
- 10. Lay-out, plan, install, maintain and repair all types of electrical equipment.
- 11. Applies for all electrical permits for work performed in the School District.
- 12. Directly oversees projects as assigned and provides electrical expertise as requested.

- 13. Signs all electrical plans for the District requiring a Master Electrician's License.
- 14. Performs preventive and predictive maintenance tasks.
- 15. Other tasks as assigned by the Director of Buildings and Grounds.

Work Schedule:

Monday thru Friday – 7:00am to 3:30pm Hours may vary to meet district needs.

<u>In compliance with The Americans with Disabilities Act the following represents the physical\environmental demands</u>

- 1. This position requires a majority of time spent standing, walking, and lifting.
- 2. Weights of object to lifted and carried will range from 10 to 100 pounds.
- 3. Climbing of stairs, bleachers, and ladders is often required as well as movements such as bending, twisting, and kneeling.
- 4. Excellent sensory skills are important (sight, hearing, and speech) as well as the ability to operate assorted types of machinery\equipment.
- 5. Exposure to heat, cold, dust, fumes, vibration, and noise.
- 6. Repetitive movements of both hands and feet are often required.
