

# The Christmas Pickle

You may have noticed that many people have a holiday ornament shaped like a pickle on their Christmas tree, or you may even have one on your tree. There are a lot of different interesting stories out there about how this tradition originated, but the "true" story is equally surprising:

A common story told about the tradition of a pickle ornament was that is a long-standing German tradition. The story goes that German families hung a real pickle on the tree each year and the first child to find it got an extra present.

Another common story has to do with a Civil War prisoner of war that begged a guard for a pickle, how the guard took pity on him and gave him the pickle, and how eating that pickle saved the soldier's life.

A third popular story about the tradition is that it is related to an old Medieval story of two Spanish boys that were killed by an evil innkeeper who hid their bodies in a pickle barrel (how's that for a heartwarming holiday story?) and that

evening St. Nicholas stopped at the same inn and found the boys in the barrel and miraculously brought them back to life.

What is the real story on this long-standing tradition of hanging a pickle ornament on the tree? In the 1880's the large department store Woolworth's started selling glass ornaments from Germany that were shaped like different fruits and vegetables. Their customers loved these ornaments and bought them up, except for the pickle shaped ornaments that, for whatever reason, people did not seem interested in. Faced with a huge inventory of unsold glass pickle ornaments, an enterprising salesclerk made up a story claiming the ornament represented a very old German tradition and the first child to find it got an extra present, and suddenly these pickle ornaments were flying off the shelves! Their customers in New York City, many of them immigrants from Europe, fell in love with the story about the German tradition and some even bought one to send back to their relatives in Germany proudly telling them they could use a glass pickle instead of a real one from now on. Soon, these American glass pickles became very popular in Germany as well and they are now found on nearly every tree in Germany as a result.

I thought this was an interesting story of great imagination and entrepreneurship, but be careful about making up stories about your products or services or you might find yourself in a "pickle"!

- 181 Members are currently tracking for certification.



# Stress, depression and the holidays: Tips for coping.

The holiday season often brings unwelcome guests — stress and depression. And it's no wonder. The holidays often present a dizzying array of demands — cooking meals, shopping, baking, cleaning and entertaining, to name just a few.

But with some practical tips, you can minimize the stress that accompanies the holidays. You may even end up enjoying the holidays more than you thought you would.

### Tips to prevent holiday stress and depression

When stress is at its peak, it's hard to stop and regroup. Try to prevent stress and depression in the first place, especially if the holidays have taken an emotional toll on you in the past.

- 1. Acknowledge your feelings. If someone close to you has recently died or you can't be with loved ones for other reasons, realize that it's normal to feel sadness and grief. You can't force yourself to be happy just because it's the holiday season.
- 2. **Reach out.** If you feel lonely or isolated, seek out community, religious or other social events or communities. It may also may help to talk to a friend or family member about your concerns. Volunteering your time or doing something to help others also is a good way to lift your spirits and broaden your friendships. For example, consider dropping off a meal and dessert at a friend's home during the holidays.
- 3. **Be realistic.** The holidays don't have to be perfect or just like last year. As families change and grow, traditions and rituals often change as well. Choose a few to hold on to, and be open to creating new ones. For example, if your adult children can't come to your home, find new ways to celebrate together, such as sharing pictures, emails or videos.

- 4. **Set aside differences.** Try to accept family members and friends as they are, even if they don't live up to all of your expectations. Set aside grievances until a more appropriate time for discussion. And be understanding if others get upset or distressed when something goes awry. Chances are they're feeling the effects of holiday stress and depression, too.
- 5. **Stick to a budget.** Before you do your gift and food shopping, decide how much money you can afford to spend. Then stick to your budget. Don't try to buy happiness with an avalanche of gifts.
- 6. **Plan ahead.** Set aside specific days for shopping, baking, connecting with friends and other activities. Consider whether you can shop online for any of your items. Plan your menus and then make your shopping list. That'll help prevent last-minute scrambling to buy forgotten ingredients. And make sure to line up help for meal prep and cleanup.
- 7. **Learn to say no.** Saying yes when you should say no can leave you feeling resentful and overwhelmed. Friends and colleagues will understand if you can't participate in every project or activity.
- 8. **Don't abandon healthy habits.** Don't let the holidays become a free-for-all. Overindulgence only adds to your stress and guilt. Have a healthy snack before holiday meals so that you don't go overboard on sweets, cheese or drinks. Eat healthy meals. Get plenty of sleep.

Include regular physical activity in your daily routine. Avoid excessive tobacco, alcohol and drug use.

- 9. **Take a breather.** Make some time for yourself. Find an activity you enjoy. Take a break by yourself. Spending just 15 minutes alone, without distractions, may refresh you enough to handle everything you need to do. Some options may include: Taking a walk at night and stargazing; Listening to soothing music; Read a book.
- 10. Seek professional help if you need it. Despite your best efforts, you may find yourself feeling persistently sad or anxious, plagued by physical complaints, unable to sleep, irritable and hopeless, and unable to face routine chores. If these feelings last for a while, talk to your doctor or a mental health professional.

### Take control of the holidays

Don't let the holidays become something you dread. Instead, take steps to prevent the stress and depression that can descend during the holidays. Learn to recognize your holiday triggers, such as financial pressures or personal demands, so you can combat them before they lead to a meltdown. With a little planning and some positive thinking, you can find peace and joy during the holidays.

### Health and Safety Training

When do you complete annual Health and Safety Trainings and what means do you use to complete the trainings for all of the groups within your district of which they are required? This was a topic of conversation during the November Health and Safety Zoom call. Of the group, most schools have educational and kitchen staff complete their required Blood Borne Pathogens, Employee Right to Know, Chemical Hygiene trainings at the beginning of the school year. For myself, being from a smaller school, I held BBP training for teachers and paraprofessionals and kitchen staff (Kitchen staff also had ERTK training) in the fall and administered the ERTK training for high school Science, Industrial Arts, Art and Theater staff in the spring. This was primarily due to managing the burden of documenting training attendance.

In our group most districts are offering training online versus in person. The online trainings ranged from PowerPoints with quizzes at the end to professionally prepared video trainings. While online trainings are most common, the consensus was that in-person trainings are more impactful.

Every district in the conversation holds their custodian/maintenance staff trainings the first week after the school year ends. The reason for this was two fold, the change of daily routines for full time staff and the addition of seasonal staff. Everyone agreed the start of summer is ideal due to the changing of the daily routine.

The discussion got me thinking, just what is happening across MASMS in regard to Health and Safety training. What are the state wide percentages in regard to online versus in-person trainings. Who do districts use to prepare and present the trainings? Maybe this information could help facility managers in their presenta-





# **Education Leadership Emerges**

The in-coming House and Senate DFL majorities are starting to organize their respective assemblies for the new budget session, which begins on January 3. The House Education Finance committee will be chaired by Rep. Cheryl Youakim (DFL Hopkins). Rep. Youakim chaired the House Education Policy committee in 2019-2020 before taking on the Property Tax committee role. She's extremely knowledgeable about education funding and school levy issues and works as a paraprofessional in west metro schools. Rep. Laurie Pryor (DFL Minnetonka) will take over as the House Education Policy chair. She's recently served on the Early Childhood and Health committees.

In the Senate, they have decided to split the E-12 Budget & Policy Division into two committees. The E-12 Budget Division will be chaired by Sen. Mary Kunesh (DFL New Brighton). Sen. Kunesh served as a licensed school media specialist in Robbinsdale schools. The Senate Education Policy Committee will be chaired by Sen. Steve Cwodzinski (DFL Eden

Prairie). Sen. Cwodzinkski is a retired social studies teacher from Eden Prairie schools. He's been the chief author of a bill to require Civics education in 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade as a requirement for graduation.

The next big data point for the 2023 legislative session is the November budget forecast, which should be released in the first few days of December at the latest. The assumptions is the state will have upwards of a \$9 billion surplus to work with as the Governor and new legislature work to set a new two-year operating budget, beginning July 1, 2023.




