ENTRANCE AGE

I. PURPOSE

A student must be five years of age on or before September 1 of any year to be eligible to enroll in kindergarten classes. The Milaca School District #912 views this age requirement as developmentally appropriate for a child to function successfully in the kindergarten program.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Milaca School District is in compliance with the Minnesota Statutes 2002, 120A.20 subdivision 1, that states a person shall not be admitted to a public school (1) as a kindergarten pupil, unless the pupil is at least five years of age on September 1 of the calendar year in which the school year for which the pupil seeks admission commences; or (2) as a 1st grade student, unless the pupil is at least six years of age on September 1 of the calendar year in which the school year for which the pupil seeks admission commences or has completed kindergarten; except that any school board may establish a policy for admission of selected pupils at an earlier age.

EARLY ENTRANCE

The Milaca School District #912 recognizes that early entrance to school is an important decision and should be limited to and reflective of the following process:

A. Selection Criteria for Early Entrance into Elementary School

To be eligible for early entrance to school the student must meet the criteria in the prioritized order listed below.

- 1. Birthday is prior to October 1st of the year student seeks early entrance.
- 2a. Demonstrated academic success and social maturity in a preschool program validated by a letter of recommendation from preschool teacher/director.

OR

- 2b. Social maturity is demonstrated by social maturity assessments (Attachment 1) conducted by school personnel (usually a kindergarten teacher).
- 3. Mental age is in the high average range as demonstrated by ability assessments conducted by the school psychologist.
- 4. Competency in academic skills is demonstrated by the student on the Milaca Kindergarten Assessment which is conducted by a kindergarten teacher.

B. Application Procedure

- 1. Secure application form at the elementary school of attendance. Complete and return by August 1. Applications received after August 1 may be considered in the case of extenuating circumstances provided assessments can be completed prior to September 1.
- 2. Interview of parents and child by principal, reading specialist or kindergarten teacher.
- 3. Assessments and Observations
 - a. Social Maturity
 - b. Psychological
 - c. Milaca Kindergarten Assessment

Cost incurred for assessment to be borne by parents. Costs include assessment materials; professional time for assessing, scoring and reporting; substitute for teacher (if necessary).

- 4. Complete medical check-up at the parent's expense. Immunizations must meet State of Minnesota requirements.
- 5. Post-assessment interview with the parents and school personnel.
 - a. The decision for allowing early entrance will be made at team staffing of school personnel (usually the principal and the kindergarten teacher).
 - b. If entered early, the child will be placed on a trial basis. The probationary period will consist of the first month of school. An evaluation using the "Early Entrance Probationary Checklist" (Attachment 2) may be requested by the teacher at the end of the first month with the option to withdraw the student from early entrance by the admittance committee.
 - c. The early entrance assessment packet will be kept in the student's cumulative file.
