Students Tour Washington D.C.

wenty-one students in tenth grade spent four days touring Washington D.C. and ▲ Virginia. This was the sixth annual trip giving students the opportunity to travel educationally with their peers. The trip started early on Thursday, April 4, as the group left school at 3:15 a.m. to catch a flight to Maryland. Upon landing, students were thrown into tourist mode. Their first stop was Union Station for lunch and then headed to the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum for a self-guided tour. After the USHMM, they toured the Washington Monument, WWII Memorial, Vietnam Memorial, and the Lincoln and Korean Memorials.

On Friday, the group traveled to the White House and White House Visitor Center where students watched a video about the changes made to and within the White House under the 45 different presidential administrations. From the White House, they went to the National Cathedral, 9/11 Pentagon Memorial, Air Force Memorial, U.S. Marine Corps Memorial, and Arlington

Cemetery. At Arlington, students saw the "changing of the guard" at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Saturday's events began at the Newseum, then onto the National Archives where students participated in activities focused on the gifts exchanged between the United States and foreign nations, including painting cherry blossom trees and making origami. They also toured the Library of Congress, U.S. Capitol Building, Supreme Court, and the Air & Space Smithsonian. The day ended with a night tour of the Lincoln Memorial, Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial, FDR Memorial, and Jefferson Memorial where students enjoyed fireworks over the Potomac River in honor of the Cherry Blossom Festival.

The final day began with a tour of Mount Vernon, George Washington's home, where three students participated in a wreath laying ceremony at the burial tomb of President Washington and his wife, Martha. After Mount Vernon, the

group toured the American History and Natural History Smithsonians. It was a fabulous Milaca Public Schools
