Parking Lot Safety

Milaca Public Schools is off to a great start! As we move into the second month of school it is a good time to remind everyone of the parking lot procedures.

Bus Area: Busses drop off/pick up in the south lot. There is no vehicle access to the south lot from 7:45 to 8:15 a.m. or from 2:45 to 3:15 p.m. In addition, please observe the posted signs designating the appropriate times for parking.

Student Drop Off/Pick Up: Use the north entrance off 3rd Avenue (also known as the "Athletic Entrance") when dropping off/picking up students before or after school. When entering the lot, form a single lane of traffic until reaching the sidewalk located near door 17, where the lane splits into two. Use the right/curb side lane to drop off or pick up your child and the outside/left lane to exit back onto 3rd Avenue. There is no access to this area from 8:15 a.m. - 2:55 p.m. *Please note: When picking up/dropping off students, parking and leaving vehicles on this loop is prohibited.*

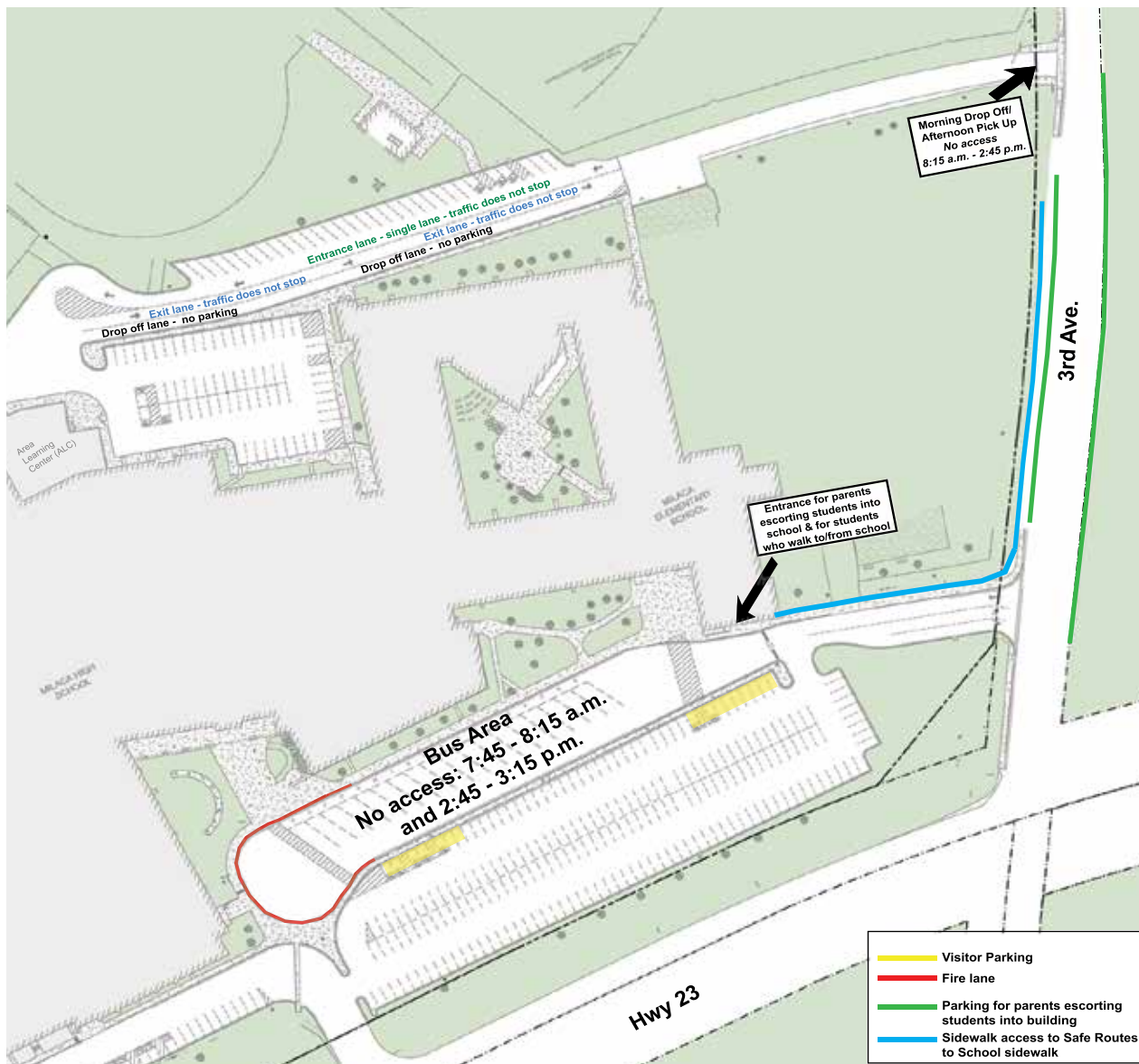
During School Day: If you need to pick up/drop off your student between 8:15 a.m. - 2:45 p.m., you may park in the 15-minute visitor parking in the south lot. Also park here when you need to run into the building to drop off forgotten items.

Walking Students Into Building: If you wish to walk your student into the building, park on 3rd Avenue and enter through the Elementary Office door (door 4). Parents cannot enter through the north entrances when walking their student in. They must enter through the front office.

Student Walkers: Walkers exit through the south doors of the building and walk east to the city sidewalks. This allows access to the Safe Routes to School sidewalk on the north side of the property.

Fire Lanes: This past summer, our grounds crew painted the fire lane curbs red. It is illegal to park in these areas, so emergency vehicles have clear access to the building in case of an emergency. You will be asked to move if you park in the fire lanes.

We recognize this may not always be convenient for families. Please understand that following these procedures is for the safety of our students. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
