The Duo team placed first at the local Ely Speech Meet earlier in the season. Varsity team members, Lukas Morgan and Troy Bissonette, also had a successful year in the category of Dramatic Duo. Morgan and Bissonette placed in the top six steadily during the year. Junior Varsity team members, Laura Ames and Ruthie Morgan, have been shadowing the Varsity Team this year, and will be ready to start competing next year.

The Northeast Range Speech Coach, Jennifer Kaufenberg, is starting a mentoring program next season and hopes to recruit students in grades 5-8 to join the team. New members will be paired with a varsity speakers and have opportunities to compete in local junior speech meets. "These meets also provide opportunities for senior team members, they can be judges at the meets and gain experience on a completely different level," said Mrs. Kaufenberg. Team Captain, Riley Pecha said that the team had a great year and he is looking forward to getting the team ready for the next season.
