ISD #363 will continue to offer e-Learning Days for students this school year. You may be asking what this means for your family. When we have weather-related school cancellations, instructional time is lost, and the momentum in classrooms slows down. We believe that while e-Learning days cannot replace the face-to-face time students have with their teachers and peers, these days provide better continuity of learning when school is interrupted.

The Minnesota Department of Education approved this e-Learning opportunity to use, if needed, for days missed due to inclement weather. We want to ensure that we are educating all of our students with real-time, up-to-date content. In accordance with MN State Statute 122a.414, the School Board approved using up to 5 e-Learning Days.

These days will be announced using the same communication methods we use for school cancellation (phone, text, website, etc.). ISD #363 will make every attempt to notify students, staff and families the night before calling an eLearning day. An e-Learning Day will be very similar, if not the same, as a Distance Learning Day.

Because of several factors, not every canceled [snow] day will be an e-Learning day – some snow days may be made up, while others may be an e-Learning day. We know this is different than a traditional day of school, but we believe we can use e-Learning days to continue offering each of our students a positive learning experience, even when we are unable to have classes.
