Children have supervised free play while parents discuss topics chosen based on parent input, such as discipline, building social skills, and answering kids' "tough" questions. This class is a great introduction to the classroom and separation for kids who will be starting preschool, as well as a nice opportunity for parents of preschoolers to learn ways to enhance their child's learning at home and get to know other parents.

Ortonville School Early Childhood Screening

Who: Children 3-5 who haven't been screened

When: Friday, September 26 Friday, October 10

Appointments throughout the day

Early Childhood Screening is a free opportunity for children 3-5 to be screened for vision, hearing, height, weight, speech, coordination, cognitive development (thinking skills), and social/emotional skills. Through screening, the school is able to identify factors that might interfere with a child's learning, growth and development and then give a child extra support if needed. The earlier supports can be provided, the more effective they will be.

Screening is required by Minnesota law prior to Kindergarten entrance; the best time for a child to be screened is at age three and a half. If you have a child between ages three and five who has NOT been screened, please contact the Ortonville School at 839-6181, ext. 111, to schedule an appointment on one of the above dates.
