
Meet David Graf!



How to Take Better Pictures with your Digital Camera

Description: This class is designed for the Beginner through AD-VANCED level photographer who wants to better understand how their interchangeable Digital Single Lens Reflex camera and/or their Interchangeable Lens Mirrorless Camera works and how to apply that knowledge when taking pictures.

The class will concentrate on the basic mechanics on how and why a digital camera forms an image and will give the participant an opportunity to improve their photography skills through six weekly classroom sessions & three optional weekend workshops.

The course will meet weekly on Thursday evenings starting September 21st and run for six consecutive weeks. The optional workshops meet on various weekends for those students who wish to expand their photography knowledge via a "hands on" approach.

The course includes one copy of Bryan Peterson's "Understanding Photography Field Guide". The participant must have access to their own digital camera, as well as a computer to transfer images to a USB 2.0 flash drive or an email account to turn in assign-

ments.



This class can also be beneficial to students who have advanced point and shoot cameras but is not intended for students that have camera phones. If a prospective student has any questions please contact the instructor.

The class needs a minimum of eight students and is limited to 15.

Basic DSLR Class

This class will help you know what the buttons on your DSLR camera do. My goal is to get you from shooting in Auto mode to Manual mode. I will talk you though ISO, F-stop, Shutter speed, and how they all work together. This will allow you to get more out of your expensive camera and have control of the images in more situations. Referendum Revenue Authorization

The board of Independent School District No. 2903 (Ortonville Public School) is proposing a 3 question referendum of \$375,000 starting in 2018. This is \$50,000 less than the 2016 request of \$425,000. All 3 questions combined would utilize the maximum state aid available to the district.

Question 1: Operating Levy of \$150,000 Levy of \$101,000 Aid of \$49,000

Question 2: Technology Bond Request of \$150,000 Levy of \$150,000 The new Ag to School Credit will provide 40% levy offset to

eligible Ag Property owners

Question 3: Operating Levy of \$78,000 Levy of \$48,000 Aid of \$30,000
