

How to Take Better Pictures with your Digital Camera

Description: The photographs we take let us share our personal experiences with others but often those photos don't turn out exactly the way we thought they would.

This six-week class is designed for any photographer who wants to better understand the workings of their Digital Camera* and how to apply that knowledge when taking pictures. The class meets on six consecutive Wednesday nights at 7pm, September 12th - October 17th, and has three optional weekend workshops.

The course concentrates on the basic mechanics of how and why a digital camera forms an image effectively. The class gives the participant an opportunity to improve their photography skills through the better understanding of proper exposure and thoughtful composition.

The class is filled with practical tips and offers "in the field" workshop demonstrations of the proven techniques that are used by professional photographers. The class itinerary also includes tips on basic digital photo editing with common software available from Adobe as well as Nikon. Canon etc.

The class is taught by local award-winning freelance photographer Steve Berkner whose photo assignments over the years include travel to four continents and 17 countries. Berkner is a 1981 graduate of Ortonville High School and a 1986 graduate of Moorhead State University where he graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Journalism.

Participants are expected to have access to a digital camera, a modern computer and a USB 2.0 flash drive.

The cost of the class is \$110 and includes one copy of Bryan Petersons book "Understanding Photography Field Guide" (retail \$24.99). The course meets at the Berkner Pizza party room in Ortonville.

*Please note that this class is intended for modern digital inter-changeable lens cameras (both DSLR and ILC) or advanced "point and shoot" cameras. Please contact the instructor if you have any questions concerning your cameras capabilities.

The class needs a minimum of six participants and is limited to a maximum of 16.
