Sport Committee Annual Timelines and Procedures

- Timelines
 - Standing Sport Committee Meetings
 - Pre-season Meeting
 - Timing: prior to the Interpretation Meeting
 - Purpose: review sport specific agenda for Interpretation Meeting
 - Playoff Meeting
 - Timing: immediately following the end of the regular season (if needed)
 - Purpose: determine playoff participants
 - Post-Season Meeting
 - Timing: within one month after the Championships
 - Purpose: discuss new initiatives, improvements, and implementation
 - Suggestions from the AD's Membership
 - Suggestions from the Coaches Association Membership
 - RIIL School Survey for movement in the off-year of a realignment
 - Review RIIL Rules and Regulations Sport Specific Sections
 - o Propose rule eliminations, modifications, additions
 - Rule changes will be reviewed by the RIIAAA E-Board, then proposed to the PCOA for adoption
 - Review NFHS Sport Specific Rule Book and new Rule Changes
 - o Propose rule eliminations, modifications, additions
 - Rule changes will be reviewed by the RIIAAA E-Board, then PCOA for proposal to the NFHS
 - Pre-NFHS National Meeting
 - Off-Season Meeting (if needed)
 - Purpose: discuss issues that require additional dialogue
 - o Realignment-Year Timeline
 - At the conclusion of the season in a realignment year, Sport Committees will receive:
 - Formula Power Rankings and Guidelines
 - Committee Member List
 - Procedure for alignment
 - Timeline for alignment
 - Rankings determined by the Formula

- Check for accuracy
- Determine Division Breakdown, Regular Season Schedule Format, and Playoff Format
- Realignment Proposal sent in the initial Survey to Schools
- Deadline Set for Alignment Survey of Schools
- Review Survey Results and Finalize Realignment
 - Must be Completed 5 weeks prior to the PCOA meeting date
- RIIAAA E-Board Review for endorsement
- PCOA Vote
- Submission Deadline for Final Realignment Proposals
 - Fall Sports Deadline: ~February 15th
 - Fall Sport Realignments will be voted on by the PCOA in March
 - Winter Sports Deadline: ~May 1st
 - Winter Sport Realignments will be voted on by the PCOA in June
 - Spring Sports Deadline: ~October 1st
 - Spring Sport Realignments will be voted on by the PCOA in November
- o Review Membership
 - Director (assigned by the RIIL)
 - Co-Director (assigned by the RIIAAA)
 - Administrators (one or more)
 - Athletic Directors (two or more)
 - Coaches (one per division, NOT sub-division)
 - Coaching Representatives must always represent the membership of their coaches association. Division Representatives must represent their specific division when discussing pertinent issues.
 - Coaching Representatives must present consistent surveys of the membership by the coaches association on key issues within the sport committee
 - Coaching Association Presidents (can be invited as a non-voting member)
 - Officials (non-voting member)
- Realignment Formula
 - o Two (2) years between realignment
 - Process for movement in the off-year of a realignment:
 - Re-Calculate the Realignment Formula to include the first year of the realignment
 - Survey all schools: Do you request to switch divisions for next year?
 - Results of the survey will be disseminated to the sport committee for review
 - Any request to move up a division will be matched with a corresponding request to move down according to the official rankings. Division alignment, number of teams in a division & playoff structure will not be adjusted.
 - o Formula
 - 70% Weighted win/loss over past six (6) years in regular season League games
 - The contact sports of Football, Ice Hockey, Wrestling, and Lacrosse utilize 60%
 - 10% Enrollment

- The contact sports of Football, Ice Hockey, Wrestling, and Lacrosse utilize 20%
- 10% Weighted Win percentage in regular season League games over previous two yrs
- 10% Weighted Tournament Success Factor in post-season play over the previous two yrs
- Exception: Football, Ice Hockey, Wrestling, and Boys Lacrosse: 20% enrollment
- o Division win weights:
 - Division I = 1.00
 - Division II = 0.60
 - Division III = 0.36
 - Division IV = 0.22
- The following sports will be included in the alignment criteria:
 - Baseball, G/B Basketball, Fast Pitch Softball, Field Hockey, Football, G/B Indoor Track,
 G/B Lacrosse, G/B Soccer, G/B Swimming, G/B Tennis, G/B Volleyball, and Wrestling.
- The following sports will be excluded from the current alignment criteria but may use the rankings as a guide in the realignment process:
 - Cheerleading, G/B Cross Country, G/B Golf, Gymnastics, G/B Ice Hockey, Unified Sports, and G/B Outdoor Track.
 - These sports are excluded due to limited number of teams, facilities, regional play, etc.

Related Committees

- o RIIAAA Realignment Review Committee
 - This committee shall meet 3-4 times in a realignment year to review each Sport Committee Realignment Proposal prior to the PCOA final vote
 - Each proposal will be analyzed based on the established Realignment Guidelines
 - Omissions or issues raised by the Realignment Review Sub-Committee will be brought back to the Sport Committee for correction
 - Realignment Proposals will receive "Endorsement" and forwarded to the PCOA
 - Proposals not revised based on Realignment Committee feedback will be "Contested" with a specific explanation provided and forwarded to the PCOA
- Standing Sport Committees
 - All Standing Sport Committees will be established in accordance with Article I Section 5 of the RIIL Rules & Regulations.
 - Procedure
 - Sport Committees will meet to establish an initial alignment proposal
 - Initial alignments based on the official team rankings will be sent to schools with a survey. Schools may request to be considered to move up or down a division.
 - Any team ranked in the bottom 40% of a division is eligible to move down to a lower division as long as a corresponding team requests to move up a division
 - Based on the survey results, a final alignment with all requirements will be submitted to the RRC and PCOA.

• Realignment Proposals

- o Each sport's realignment proposal must include the following:
 - Sport Committee Members

- Important Dates:
 - Regular Season Start Date
 - Length of Regular Season (weeks required)
 - Last Day of the Regular Season
 - Post-Season Start Date
 - Post-Season End Date
- Division and Sub-Division breakdown
 - Sub-Division breakdown must be snaked according to the formula ranking
- Schedule breakdown
 - Division/Sub-Division games
 - Total Number of league games
- Specific Playoff structure breakdown
- Plan for Sub-Varsity Games
- Structure for tie-breakers in playoff seeding once teams have Qualified
- Miscellaneous Procedures
 - o To be Eligible for divisional playoffs:
 - Division 1 Teams must Win 30% of their games to be eligible for the playoffs.
 - All other Division Teams must Win 40% of their games to be playoff eligible.
 - Minimum of 4 teams must qualify to provide a semifinal round in all sports.
 - Sport Committees are required to identify the structure of the playoffs including how many Eligible teams will Qualify for playoff berths.
 - Not all Eligible teams will Qualify for the playoffs.
 - Division Championship Playoff Brackets must include 4 teams or more
 - Teams tied for the final playoff position are not automatically qualified
 - Whenever time and athlete safety allow, the RIIL will schedule preliminary
 games between teams tied for the final position in the playoffs. Tie-breakers
 cannot be used to eliminate a team from the playoffs unless approved by the RIIL.
 - The season schedule must allow for a short break between the end of the regular season and beginning of the playoffs in order to fit in these games if needed.
 - Sports with postseason schedule limitations often opt to declare a specific number of teams that qualify for the playoffs (ex. Football and Ice Hockey).
 - Qualifications to declare a Division "Champion". If a division is broken down into subdivisions, said sub division must meet one of the two requirements in order to declare a Division Champion:
 - A sub-division must contain more than 15% of the total number of teams.
 - A division can only be divided into two sub-divisions.
 - If there are too many sub-divisions within a division, only the #1 seed in the divisional playoffs (or the team with the best record in the overall division) will be considered the division champions by the RIIL.
 - Realignment Final Rank Tie-Breakers

- To be used after the Realignment Survey when two or more teams are tied (to the hundredths place) in the Final Rank and the teams fall in different divisions:
- Inform both teams that the Sport Committee will be making a final decision. Would one of the tied teams prefer to be placed in a higher division?
- The Sport Committee has the option to move ALL tied teams as a group into the higher or lower division. The tied teams can not be separated.

Basic Playoff Seeding Tiebreakers:

- If there is a tie between two teams:
 - 1. Head-to-head record.
 - 2. Quality wins vs. higher ranked team in your sub-division
 - Must be a common opponent
 - 3. Quality wins vs. higher ranked team in the division
 - Must be a common opponent
 - 4. Defensive runs against vs. common opponents
 - 5. Average defensive runs against in all league games
 - 6. Coin flip
- If there is a tie between more than two teams:
- When breaking ties between more than one team, a single team will advance
 - 1. Pool record between all tied teams.
 - 2. Quality wins vs. higher ranked team in your sub-division
 - Must be a common opponent
 - 3. Quality wins vs. higher ranked team in the division
 - Must be a common opponent
 - 4. Defensive runs against in pool
 - 5. Defensive runs against vs. common opponents
 - 6. Average defensive points against in all league games
 - 7. Coin flip
