




Referendum Vote

November 14 and 16, 4:00 - 7:00 each evening. This year FALL Conferences will be for 4K and 3rd-12th grade.

We are asking that parents of 9th - 12th graders sign up for a College and Career Ready Student Led Conference with your child's Focus teacher. Your student will take you through what Redefining Ready is, what metrics they are tracking in their Personalized Learning Plan, and their plans for the future as the move towards high school graduation. You may also sign up with subject area teachers if desired, as has happened traditionally. All other grades are encouraged to sign up with teachers that their child has.

Dia De Los Muertos

Mrs. Lile's Spanish II Class did many activities to learn about and commemorate the Day of the Dead (Dia De Los Muertos). It is a two day holiday (November 1 & 2) that reunites the living and dead. Families create ofrendas (Offerings) to honor their departed family members that have passed. The Spanish class put together an ofrenda outside the classroom. It was decorated with bright yellow marigold flowers, photos of the departed, and the favorite

foods and drinks of the one being honored. The offerings are believed to encourage visits from the land of the dead as the departed souls hear their prayers, smell their foods and join in the celebrations.

The class learned how to make tamales with the guidance from Ms. Jones. It took two days! They also did classroom presentations in a few elementary classrooms sharing their new knowledge of Dia De Los Muertos.
