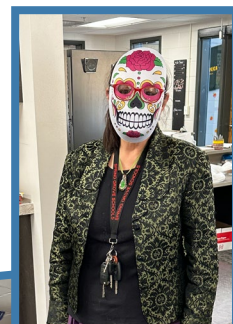

Child Tax Credit Deadline is November 15!

Eligible families may easily claim the expanded Child Tax Credit (CTC) until Nov. 15, 2022. Eligible families (typically this means their income is below \$12,550 if filing single, or \$25,100 if filing married) can claim the CTC at [GetCTC.org/mn](https://www.getctc.org/mn). Families can also use this link to file their tax return if they have not yet received the third stimulus check.
