Reminder: Free Financial Aid Events and Scholarship Opportunity for Minnesota Students

To support local high schools with their financial aid efforts, the Ready, Set, FAFSA series will again be offered to students and families this fall. Running September 27 to October 25, five virtual sessions will cover the college application process, general financial aid information, details on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the Minnesota Dream Act for undocumented students, and other ways to pay for college. All sessions will have simultaneous interpretation in Spanish, Somali, and Hmong. Financial aid experts from local colleges will be available during the events to answer questions in the chat. Students who attend will be eligible to win a \$500 scholarship. Registration is open now for families.

The series, called "Ready, Set, FAFSA" is a collaboration between MDE, the Minnesota Office of Higher Education, ECMC The College Place, and Minnesota Goes to College.

(Reimbursable means it is CHEAPER for your parents when they pay for your meals \$1.10 for breakfast; \$2.65/\$2.75 for lunches)

For BREAKFAST:

For LUNCH: your tray, once again, needs at least 3 components, and ONE of those components needs to



If your tray does



not have these components, you will be charged

\$2.50 for breakfast / \$4.95 for lunch --- and it will make your parents unhappy.



Serving sizes of the food components are ½ cup.

Side notes: raisins or craisins count as a fruit component; 3 cucumber slices does NOT equal ½ cup of vegetables one small cherry tomato does NOT equal 1/2 cup.

But, if you get full before you get to a component, for example: your applesauce cup, etc and if they are UNOPENED, please put it on the



"sharing cart" and others can help themselves to these items.
