# Gaylord High School Joins Basketball League

Gaylord High School and six other schools of the Tenth District have formed a basketball league, designed to add interest to the regular season's play.

The name of the new association is the Tomahawk League (borrowed from the old Tomahawk baseball league), and its members, in addition to Gaylord, are Morton, Morgan, Franklin, Fairfax, Gibbon and Winthrop. Franklin, incidentally, will not be represented on the court this year because it lacks a playing floor.

Since all member schools had drawn up their schedules before the Tomahawk was formed on Thursday of last week, any team which has six games scheduled with not less than three league members will be eligible for the trophy. For the 1945-46 season, it has been suggested that each team play at least four league members and that every member of the group be scheduled at least every other season. Gaylord's schedule for 1944-45 includes two games each with Gibbon, Fairfax and Winthrop.

Coach Pappas of Fairfax will serve as league secretary and will furnish weekly standings, after the beginning of the season, to each of the participating schools.

The league idea is not new. Gaylord belongs to a football league, the Little Five, consisting of Franklin, Fairfax, Gibbon, Winthrop and Gaylord, while among the bigger schools of the district Redwood, New Ulm, Sleepy Eye and Springfield are members of the Little Ten Conference.
