Tomahawk League Re-organized With Seven School Membership

A meeting of those superintendents and coaches interested in the continuance and extension of a Tomahawk League was held at Gibbon on November 14, 1945, at the call of Supt. Larson. The superintendents present were: Larson, Salzwedel, McPherson, Wegner, Langbell, and Paquette. The coaches present were: M. Anderson, Sandholm, Jonason, Hedman, Stetzler and Givold.

The minutes of this meeting follow:

Paquette was unanimously elected "Big Chief" of the Tomahawk Conference. It was moved by Hedman and seconded by Stetzler that in order to be eligible for a championship in football a team must have played each of the other six teams (Gaylord, Winthrop, Gibbon, Fairfax, Franklin, Morton, Morgan) in the conference, unless this rule should be set aside by unanimous consent of the members of the conference not involved in the irregularity. Motion carried.

It was moved by Langbell and seconded by McPherson that the home team send out contracts to the visiting teams on or before November 22. Motion carried.

It was moved by Wegner and seconded by McPherson that each team pay \$7.50 to the conference treasury,

payment to be made to Supt. Paquette by November 22. Motion carried.

It was moved by Hedman and seconded by Salzwedel that \$10 be allowed to Gaylord for the purchase of their 1944 football trophy, \$10 to Fairfax for their 1945 football trophy, and that a standard trophy be purchased for the 1945-46 winners in the basketball, and a similar trophy for the 1946 winners in football, \$10 to be the amount allowed on the payment of each of these trophies, including the engraving of the same. Motion carried.

It was moved by Stetzler and seconded by Langbell that for the current year all conference basketball games be counted in computing the percentage of games won, and that for future years every conference team must play every other conference team in order to be eligible for conference championship. Motion carried.

It was moved by Larson and seconded by Stetzler that the winning teams must, without delay, report their scores to the "Big Chief", and that he, in turn, must send each member school a weekly report of conference standings. Motion carried.
