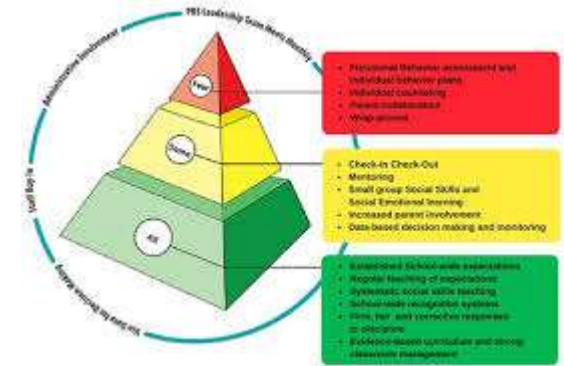
PBIS Recognition

Acknowledge and reinforcing positive behavior is one of the best ways to change inappropriate behavior. We will continue using our **Eagle Tickets**, which students can earn for being safe, respectful, and responsible.



How can parents support PBIS?

1. Ask your child about his/her school day.
2. Communicate and work with your child's teacher. We are on the same team.
3. Review behavior expectations with your child. (Home behaviors vs. school behaviors).
4. Discuss how to be safe, respectful, and responsible at home, at school, and in the community.
5. Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone when upset.
6. Be active and involved in school activities at **Tower Soudan Elementary**.



Teacher Expectations

Throughout the school year, your child will practice how to behave in different areas of the school based on our new behavior matrix. Teachers will help students learn what the expectations “look” and “sound” in every setting during the school day. These lessons will be re-taught and reinforced throughout the school year and become a regular part of our instructional program.
