#### **Bob Johnson**

First of all the VSBIT Inappropriate Behavior Workshops are taking place this week. I need an approximate number of attendees to have the proper amount of handouts. Please get me your numbers. In regards to the music issue (Napster like issue). This started with concerns about artist not getting paid for use of their music. We may need to have a license to be able to play music for such events as dance/gymnastics. This can cost around \$90 a year.

David Marlow: My coach has looked online and the best price she found was \$500.

TJ Powers: You may already have a license through your Musical/Drama Department, and you should look into that.

Tom Conte: Does this license need to be renewed? Bob Johnson: Yes, yearly.

## • Leadership Conference

#### Melba Masse / Dan Marlow

Dan Marlow: There were 282 kids from 59 different schools who attended this year's conference. We had roughly 400 plus there for the awards banquet. This has grown tremendously over the years. Melba is in the process of going through the evaluations, but can give more info later on. This whole process could not take part with the tremendous effort from Melba Masse. Dan publicly thanked Melba, and the 50 plus facilitators that attended. Melba Masse: I have quickly scanned through the evaluations. Kids made mention that they would like to have some adults from their schools attend. Kids complained about being up too late and that there was too much sitting. Students seemed happy about the meals with the exception of breakfast. The rooms were overall rated ok, but some kids did not like sharing rooms/beds. With the workshops space may have been an issue. Kids loved Ed G., and the really liked Dan S. as well as speakers. We offered swimming for the first time. 80 kids signed up and not one showed up to swim. We will not offer that again. No comments on the lunch on Monday, but I felt it was good. Thank you for all of you who came to help.

Sean Farrell: It was cool to see some of our facilitators were former attendees. It was a pat on the back for all of us here at the VSADA. Thank you Melba and Dan for that. I discussed with Bob Hingston about increasing the rate for the scholarship winners. \$100 dollars seems small, and would like to increase it to at least \$150.

A motion was made by Sean Farrell to increase scholarship to \$150. Geri Witalec Second the motion.

Dan Shepherdson: Can we afford it? Bob Hingston: Yes, and we have more opportunities to make money for the state now as well (i.e. UVM 50/50).

Paul Wheeler: Let's vote on the motion to increase the awards to \$150. Motion passed unanimously.
